PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Mountain View Environmental Inventory Project will create a complete picture of environmental conditions in our neighborhood. In the next few months, we will be gathering information about business properties, permits, and potential pollution sources to put it all in one easy-to-use database.

We're Creating a user-friendly database showing what businesses operate in Mountain View. This will include links to permits and environmental reports from different agencies, in addition to maps showing locations of potential environmental concerns. Our database will provide clear information about who (what agencies) regulate different types of pollution and other valuable information for your local community.

WHAT **IS** THE MOUNTAIN VIEW ENVIRONMENTAL INVENTORY PROJECT?

- A single, go-to source for identifying commercial properties based on business type, location, or contaminants of concern
 - A comprehensive database linking to environmental permitting and enforcement information across multiple agencies
 - An inventory of documentable current and former pollution sources
 - An aggregation of existing environmental data and reports on air, soil, and water pollution
 - A tool to help the community understand which regulatory agencies have jurisdiction over different environmental concerns
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WHAT THE PROJECT IS **NOT**...

This is NOT a remediation plan.

Remediation plans and needs are site specific, and therefore, are agency specific. This means Bernalillo County, alone, cannot develop a remediation plan.

This project will NOT provide a detailed environmental review (known as a Phase I assessment) for any particular property.

Phase I Environmental Assessments are typically property specific. The Mountain View Environmental Inventory Project is taking a larger, "bird's eye view" approach and is not focusing on any individual particular property.

This project will NOT map soil or ground water contamination.

However, our final database will provide links to agency reports that are property specific.

This is NOT a Health Impact Assessment.

However, this project is derived from previous Health Impact Assessments and community conversations.
